History of Arthur Tucker

Arthur was born about 1687, of Lancaster, Worcester, Massachusetts.

Arthur married first Mehitable Kendrick, daughter of Thomas Kendrick and Merry Perry, on 19 May 1714, in Rehoboth, Bristol, Massachusetts.

They moved in 1690 from Lancaster. He is mentioned in Rehoboth records 4 June 1695.

- 18 January 1713 or 1714 enters a stray mare and colt.
- 10 December 1715 takes a dark bay mare.
- 1715 On a list of subscribers to pay one hundred pounds.
 Also in 1716 and what more shall be needed in 1717.
- 1717 Newcomers listed in the History of North Brookfield include Arthur Tucker of Lancaster.
- 4 January 1718 Received a grant of 60 acres. later 145 acres and his children were granted 68 acres. He built on the back road east of the meeting house.
- 4 March 1723 Elizabeth Pierce, widow of John of Boston, in her will gives to Arthur Tucker of Brookfield, enough money to buy three good cows.
- 26 June 1754 Enlisted in Captain John Wright's expedition to the eastern frontiers.

He is sent into service from Brookfield. The muster roll of Captain Sylvanus Walker's Brookfield Company out from May 15 to December 27.

On a list of subscribers given to the town clerk agreeing to build a meeting house on the road northeast between the brook and

Mr. Daniel Potter's and to go off as a separate district precinct.

Arthur Tucker signed this agreement along with 2 others.

Arthur Tucker's first wife Mehitable died 28 Jan 1732. Arthur married second Mary Sabens on 17 May 1750.
