About 200 Years since, at Fowle-Court in South Moreton Parish, Berks, liv'd Randolph Whistler who had three Sons, if not more, the third of which was William Whistler of Stapenhill in Goreing, he had two Sons, viz. John and Laurence.

John Whistler, Gent. of Gatehampton in the said Parish, married and had two Sons and two Daughters, viz. Edward, Ralph, Eleanor and Margaret; the two Sisters died unmarried; from a Monument erected to their Memory, with their Portraits on the North side of the Altar in Goreing Chancel, I had part of this Account.

Laurence Whistler, second Son of William of Stapenill rented the great Farm of Cholsley; he left a Son, Laurence, and a Daughter, Elizabeth.

Laurence Whistler, Esq; Son of Laurence of Cholsley, was Purveyor to King Charles the first, and liv'd near Wallingford; (he suffer'd much when that Town was a Garrison and the Night that he was buried his House was set Fire to in several Places, and burn'd to the Ground) he married and had one Son and one Daughter, viz. William and Dorothy

Dorothy Married Henry Druce of Oakingham.
